Estonia is located in Northern Europe, on the coast of the Baltic Sea. Estonia is one of the smallest nations in Europe with 1.3 million inhabitants, comparable to Cyprus, Luxembourg and Malta. At the same time, the area of Estonia covers 45,227 km2, being larger than countries like Belgium, Holland and Denmark.

Language

The Estonian language is different from most languages spoken in Europe. It belongs to the Finno-Ugric language family, and is closely related to Finnish and distantly related to Hungarian.

Geography

Estonia has plenty of islands (1 521), lakes (around 1200 lakes with an area of over 1 ha) and forests (55% of the country is covered in forests). Where we lack is mountains - the highest peak in Estonia and in the entire Baltic States is Suur Munamägi (in translation "Big Egg Mountain"), reaching 318 metres (1,043 ft) above sea level.

CAPITAL

The capital of Estonia is Tallinn (59°25'N 24°45'E) with a population of approximately 425 000 people.
